**Provenance:** The collection was copied from originals in the possession of Ruth Yeager, Denver, Colorado, on February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

**Access Note:** The collection is available for research use.

**Scope and Content Note:** The collection consists of photocopies of documents related to the Yeager family, originally from Washington County, Tennessee. Included are copies and typed transcriptions of Civil War letters of Elijah Fisk Yeager; an address given by Elijah Fisk Yeager at his 1869 graduation from Tusculum College; biographical information about members of the Yeager family; and a photocopy of the book *Jacob Klodsloe*, a self-published book written by Abraham Hoss Yeager in 1899 documenting his life in Washington County, his time as a Civil War prisoner, etc. Files are arranged in alphabetical order by subject.
